Dr. Adams was one of the inaugural members of the NCIME executive committee in Phase I and we are thrilled to have him join us in Phase II. When asked about what intrigued him about this role he said, "I'm very please to join NCIME. I have so much respect for what they are doing—and where they are going—in training doctors for our communities".

NCIME also warmly welcomes **Audrey Henry**, **MBA** as the organization's new **Director of Operations**. Audrey brings a strong background in strategic leadership, organizational development, and operational excellence, combined with a deep commitment to Indigenous communities.
